What We Do Best

LMOW Kitchen and main office are located in Aldergrove within our LMOW Aldergrove community Station House

- Meals are delivered to the door Monday through Friday and frozen meals are available for weekends or extra meals
- Meals include a nutritious balance of protein, starch and vegetables and are low in sodium, sugar and fats
- With our own chef we continually develop or menu offerings and both hot and frozen meals include soup and dessert

We deliver approximately **250 Meals** daily throughout the City and Township.



LMOW has been serving fresh, wholesome meals, delivered right to your door in Langley for over 40 years. We have fresh hot meals as well as frozen options. Our caring delivery volunteers provide friendly social interaction for those living alone. We help our clients feel safe knowing that a volunteer will check on their well-being on delivery days and we will respond quickly if an emergency arises. We help people to retain independence in the comfort of their own homes.

A Year of Impact and growth! Our presence in the community continues to expand as does the need. Our staff and volunteers together delivered over 70,000 meals from June 2022 to July 2023.

We remain committed to growing our impact by supporting our clients through daily contact and delivery of much needed nutritional meal choices in a caring and dignified way. We are part of a working committee to extend our reach and help people living with food insecurity access to appropriate food.

Our prices continue to stay low and our subsidy and outreach available to those in need, all with the generous support of government, growers, local grocery stores, funders, grantors, and donors who support the work we do in the community and make it possible. Executive Director – Shannon Woykin




What a year LMOW has had. We have seen impressive growth in our meal service as well as the addition of the Café.

We continue to see a large portion of our revenue coming from grants which along with the generous food donations we have from our great community partners has allowed us to maintain our low prices and subsidies. With an increase of 35.6% in our meal service we also have seen that growth in revenue. A large portion of that increase has come from our partnership with TOL Strengthening Communities program. The café has had an impressive start. With a soft open in December and regular hours starting in January we have seen a wonderful impact to our community. The café had strong revenue in it's first months and also has contributed to our donation revenue as we see our customers generously tipping to help contribute to our meal program. Along with this growth we have also seen increase in our expenses. There has been an increase in salaries and wages of 35%. With the increase in meal service and addition of the Café it was a necessary increase to keep up with our growth. It also makes us especially appreciative of the additional volunteers we have needed to keep up with the increased business. We could not do any of this without the wonderful group of volunteers that make it possible to serve our community.


We end the year with excess revenue of \$54K, the board will evaluate where to designate the funds.


LMOW Volunteers 2022- 2023

In addition to our meal delivery program, we also reach our community through programs like Food & Friends and the Healthy Living Bag, as well as programs in partnership with other community organizations.

New programs:

- Spoons on Fire an intergenerational program that repurposes "ugly" fruit and vegetables into locally made jams, salsas, chutneys and soups.
- Let's talk food a group working towards a healthy, sustainable food future and to develop an action plan to enhance community food security.
- Summer backpack program supporting families in partnership with Aldergrove Rotary.

The Aldergrove Neighbourhood House incorporates the Community Food Centre model and a Neighborhood House model under one roof offering ~services for families, children, youth and seniors

- Our Firehouse Cafe is now open Monday-Friday
 9:00am-2:00pm coffee bar, fresh baked goods, soup, and sandwiches served daily
- LMOW frozen meals available for purchase to take away
- Cafe is run daily by a team of 33 LMOW volunteers!
